FYI Scraps and How to use them.

We all have fabric scraps. This month I have included an idea on how to use them. Hope you enjoy the challenge.

• String quilts are simply quilts made from your longer fabric scraps. To make a string quilt, you start with a foundation fabric or foundation paper, then use an easy sew-and-flip technique to attach strips and scraps to the foundation until the scraps completely cover the foundation. That's all there is to it!



Quilting Tip of the Month.:

Sewing

When matching up seams, try to make sure that the seams are ironed in opposite directions. This will allow the seam allowances to "nest" into each other and the seam lines will match perfectly.



When sewing a border to a pieced block or strip, sew with the border on the top, this way you can sew the seam exactly $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the edge of the straight piece, and any slight unevenness on the edge of the pieced strip will not matter.

You will have a lovely straight seam.

Recipe of the Month

Tuesday morning tea's have become interesting again with members bringing along one of their favourite cakes or slices. This month Marie Y, contributed her recipe for Carrot and Walnut slice. Maybe you would like to have a go at Marie's recipe.

CARROT AND WALNUT SLICE

1 cup S.R. flour 1 tspn. nutmeg 125g butter 3/4 cup grated carrot 1 lightly beaten egg 1/2 cup milk METHOD: 1 cup plain flour 1½ cups brown sugar ½ cup chopped walnuts 1 tspn. carb. soda ⅔ cup oil

Sift flours and nutmeg into a bowl, add sugar and rub in butter. Remove 1½ cups of mixture and press into base of a greased lamington tin. Add carrot and walnuts to the remaining flour mixture. Combine the remaining ingredients. Stir well. Pour over base and bake 35 mins. in mod. oven. Stand 5 mins. in tin before turning out on wire rack to cool.

Grease the cup in which honey or golden syrup is measured and every drop will run out.
