FYI Scraps and How to use them.

We all have fabric scraps. This month I have included an idea on how to use them. Hope you enjoy the challenge.



Cute quilt made with 2-1/2" squares and white fabric. Blocks are 4 x 4. 2-1/2" squares as well as the final border. I must try this one myself. The sashing strips are made with 4, 2-1/2" squares, the corner stones are a 9 patch block of 2-1/2" squares which include a white 2-1/2" squares in the set. Everything is 2-1/2" wide so those leftover jelly roll pieces can be used as well as other 2-1/2" strips. Maybe we can set a challenge to see who can come up with the best version????????

Quilting Tip of the Month.:

Joining rows? Start in the middle.

When sewing long rows, it is easy to create bowed seams. One way to keep these straight is by starting to sew from the middle of the seam to the edge, then rotating and sewing the other side from the middle out. Check seams are straight at regular intervals with your quilting ruler.
